





Students on DFIC obtain a far greater variety of internships in financial services, especially Capital Markets vs. students seeking internships individually



#### 1998

The DeGroote Finance Association "DFA" was founded. The club was focused on events and creating networking opportunities



The McMaster Investment Council "MacIC" was founded. The club was focused on educating students and investing through a mock portfolio

#### 2020

DFA and MacIC merged to create a clear vision statement: We are here to teach and collaborate with McMaster students to lead them in securing highly coveted careers



#### **Events**

Provides learning and networking opportunities to all students interested in finance. Ranging from large 100+ person networking events to in-depth tutorials on complex financial topics not covered in the classroom.



#### **Investment Council**

Provides analysts with a formalized education program catered towards students interested in securities analysis. Focuses on developing hard and soft skills such as financial modeling, presentation building and critical analysis of publicly traded entities.



#### **Mentorship**

Targeted at first-year students, the DFIC mentorship program aims to help introduce junior members to the world of finance. With the help of our experienced mentors, we prepare students for the workplace and teach key skills used in Capital Markets.



#### **Special Groups**

DFIC has 3 specialized teams: Quant Group, Private Capital Group (PCG), and Research Group. Our Quant team aims to cultivate top STEM talent, the PCG provides advisory services, and our Research Group publishes reports and fund updates.













### **DFIC's Diversity in our Board of Directors**




### **Club Staff Proportion by Gender**
